

Every human being learns to dance before walking.


Dancing is the silent poetry that can express the deepest feelings and give absolute freedom to the mind.

Together with music, dance creates an invincible duo that has the power to move every human being regardless of cultural affiliation.


Based on the vintage lithographs, pochoir and etching by Degas and Toulouse-Lautrec and other contemporary artists, the event depicts dances of various kinds. The exhibition is aimed at viewers of all ages. Through traditional experiences, such as the gallery of the famous French artists Edgard Degas and Henri de Toulouse-Lautrec and other contemporaries, and the extraordinary historical photographs of the Alinari archive, will retrace a journey into the visual art of dance. The visitor will be overwhelmed by unforgettable emotions by means of profound digital, virtual and multimedia experiences.

The exhibition is developed on a path divided into zones that will lead visitors to gradually understand the theme of the exhibition, accompanying them with information panels, exhibition objects and various multi-media and immersive experiences.











INTRODUCTION

The introduction begins with a video documentary about dance. The historical black and white photos of the Alinari archive cover the various eras of evolution of dance in real life and art. The path is accompanied by catchphrases about dance in different languages. Ballet costumes are exhibited.

DANCE IN THE WORLD BETWEEN ART, TRADITION AND RELIGION

Visual art has always tried to give a face to immaterial art such as dance. In all ancient cultures there are numerous representations of traditional or religious dances. In the section the ethnic dance costumes of some countries, such as Georgia, Spain etc., are exhibited, accompanied by the appropriate photos of the dance itself. MIRROR HALL

TOULOUSE-LAUTREC AND EDGARD DEGAS

The most memorable representations of ballerinas in recent centuries are undoubtedly linked to the names of Edgard Degas and Henri de Toulouse-Lautrec. Here the visitor will have the opportunity to admire the rich collection of vintage lithographs, pochoir and etchings by the two famous artists. The information panels and timeline inform about the lives of the protagonists. Their animated self-portraits interact with visitors.

ANIMATION AND INTERACTIVITY ROOM
